The chapter on "The Ottoman Jews" (pp. 256-271) shows, as do her previous works, that Minna Rozen is the best expert of the subject. Her conclusion is very much in line with Bernard Lewis, who writes: "Christians or Jews – tolerated but second-class subjects of the Muslim state. However great their economic power, they were politically penalized and socially segregated" (The Emergence of Modern Turkey, pp. 31-32). However, Minna Rozen gives an insightful depiction not only of their wealth, but also of their cultural activities, social structure and family life.
